From the principal...

For a long time Special Religious Education classes have been "protected" within public schools so that no alternate curriculum or teaching could be provided at the same time for students who were not involved. It was announced this week that this will change with ethics classes now being offered at the same time. My belief is that any teaching around values, be they religion or morals based, can only be a very good thing for our students. Within each area, we are focusing on developing the skills in our students to lead better lives, to make good choices and to contribute positively to our society and tho those more immediately around them. I am unsure as yet as to what structure the new ethics classes will be taking and there is still a lot of work to be done legislatively in seeing the policy become a reality. Throw in an election in March and the whole scheme might still not eventuate. I do hope though that the proposed new classes add in a positive way to our curriculum. A lot of lip service is paid to which system best provides the moral structures our children need when the truth is that all schools have values and morals at the heart of what they do and it the core of our business. We are about developing good citizens and a strong moral compass, a sense of responsibility and a desire to do what is good for others above ourselves is probably more important than much of the learning we concentrate so hard on.

This looks to be the first of what will be many new curriculum changes over the next three years. The advent of a national curriculum is a step in the right direction as long as it is aspirational rather than being compromised in any way. The difficulty is that students in this day need skills and conceptual understandings rather than direct knowledge because the incredible amount of information that is out there is in a fairly constant state of flux. The national curriculum will provide many challenges for schools and staff. It is a complete restructure of teaching programs and will lead to greater accountability. If the changes are educationally rather than politically driven, all the better. The last indications were that NSW would reject the initial proposal so we wait and see what transpires from here.
