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What is PBL?

Be Responsible Be Respectful Be Safe



Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a comprehensive whole school approach to addressing student wellbeing and behaviour.

So how does PBL work?

- At Vacy Public School we have 3 core expectations that underpin the PBL framework in our school. These expectations are: we are responsible, we are respectful and we are safe.
- Rules and expectations for behaviour are very clearly set out for each area of the school and are visible, in the form of signs and symbols in classrooms and out in the grounds.
- It requires staff members to be consistent, meaning that processes for managing students who need school rules to be reinforced will be the same right across the school. Each class has the same system in place to deal with issues that arise.
- The school-wide rules and expectations are explicitly taught in the classroom so that all students are aware of the rules across all areas of the school and that they understand what these rules actually mean. We need to explicitly demonstrate how to be responsible, respectful and safe at school in the same way that we teach the students how to read and write.
- Each class has PBL lesson on a Monday afternoon and then this is reinforced throughout the week.
- Our core expectations are reinforced on assembly each Monday morning and also on Friday as the class awards that are handed out are based on our core expectations.
- A PBL Reward System is put into place where students receive splats when they are seen to be complying with the school rules and expectations. These are collected and recorded. 100 splats =bronze badge, 200 splats =silver badge and 300 splats=gold badge. These badges are proudly displayed on their hats each year.
- Year 5 students who wish to nominate for leadership positions must have achieved silver level in order to do so.

At Vacy Public School we are dedicated to providing a safe environment where the students are responsible and respectful. The PBL system allows us to achieve this goal.

Traffic Safety Around Schools

Dungog Shire Council have asked our school to remind our parents what all the signs out the front of our school mean.

NO STOPPING—Means you cannot stop in that zone at anytime. This is critical especially for sight distance to school crossing/pedestrian crossings;

BUS ZONE—Bus times are displayed and for buses only during those displayed times

NO PARKING—Stopping is permitted for 2 minutes only but you must stay either in or within 3m of your vehicle. Mobility Sticker Permit holders can stay for up to 5 minutes.

Parking across driveways is illegal.
